Position Title: Hospitalist (Family Medicine or Internal Medicine)

Position Overview:

Arc Health is seeking a Hospitalist (Family Medicine or Internal Medicine) to provide care at a hospital located in Rosebud, South Dakota. This hospital is a Great Plains Area Indian Health Service Unit.

Because of the nature of the hospital and the possibility of limited inpatient volume, the clinician will agree on low volume days to report to the outpatient clinic and see walk in patients. The provider may provide inpatient rounding in the morning and work in the clinic in the afternoon. In addition, regular work duties may include the clinical supervision of mid-levels, students, and residents. Teaching is considered a vital role in providing good patient care.

- **Schedule (inpatient):** Monday – Friday, 7:30am – 4:30pm, and 24/7 call for admissions or emergencies. Weekends rounding at 9am (weekend and on-call schedule will be divided among several providers and will be set by the facility. It may vary from day to day. Clinician should be within 10-15 minutes of the hospital when on-call.
- **Schedule (outpatient):** Monday – Friday, 8:00am – 5:00pm, with the potential for some evening or weekend clinics. Shift times will fluctuate to accommodate evening/weekend clinics.

Location & Population:

This Great Plains Indian Health Service hospital is a 35 bed comprehensive medical/surgical hospital located in Rosebud, South Dakota. The hospital is the primary source of health care for the Rosebud Sioux (Sicangu Oyate) tribal members, in and around the Rosebud Sioux reservation. The mission of the hospital is to raise the physical, mental, social, and spiritual health of American Indians and Alaska Natives to the highest level

Primary Responsibilities:

- Diagnose and treat acute, episodic or chronic illnesses
- Perform comprehensive physical examinations for adults
- Participate in quality improvement/patient safety projects
- Communicate with collaborating physicians or specialists regarding patient care
- Inpatient responsibilities:
 - Reporting to morning rounds by 7:40 am every morning to give inpatient report, review patient plans, and review any special needs for patient care.
 - Perform a daily, in-person evaluation of each inpatient which includes but not limited to appropriate examination, review of laboratory test results, and medications.
 - New orders and daily progress notes are to be completed daily. If needed, a reevaluation is conducted later in the day with addendum added to the morning note.
 - Notes from ER consultations and admission History and Physicals must be completed immediately at the time of service per hospital policy.
 - EHR items will include the review of outpatient medications, order of proper inpatient medications including DVT prophylaxis if warranted (or reasons why not), and EHR order entry required with minimal to no verbal orders.
 - Review and signing of laboratory investigations, orders, review and sign off radiographic studies, interpretation and sign off of all EKG tracings and placing a note in the EHR with EKG interpretation.
 - Discharge orders must be written early in the day to allow for arrangement of transportation.
 - Medication reconciliation must be completed for all patients on admission and discharge. At discharge, discharge medications must be ordered along with discharge instructions and home supplies.
 - Consultations (ER or outpatient) and discharge summaries must be completed the day of discharge and Nutrition Guidelines per requirements.
 - All records of transfer will need to be completed prior to transfer of patients, this includes transfer note, Purchased/Referred Care (PRC), and all appropriate records must be ready for the transfer team. All consults must be placed and PRC completed for any outside treatment or testing needed upon discharge or transfer.

Candidates must be:

- Committed to rural, Tribal, and underserved healthcare
- Compassionate, mission-driven social medicine practitioners
- Interested in joining a dynamic and potentially disruptive social healthcare enterprise
- Board-certified or board-eligible in Family Medicine or Internal Medicine; Candidates just graduating residency may be Board-eligible only.
- Licensed in any state – active, unrestricted license
- Completed a US residency program
- Not had a loss of licensure or suspended licensure

- Not had a lapse in practice > 6 months leading up to assignment
- Be able to commit to a minimum of 4 weeks or more at a time
- Have a valid unrestricted DEA with schedule I-V
